This year, the Alumni Association is teaming up with the Westernaire Wranglers to raise funds for the Sponsor a Westernaire Horse program.

The Westernaire Wranglers have made gorgeous cork horses in the likeness of the current Westernaire rental string horses, affectionately referred to as the "Herd".

Sponsor ANY Westernaire horse, in memoriam or living, rental horse or owner horse, pony or draft. All money collected from the program goes directly to an encumbered fund for the Westernaire string, helping to ensure that the rental horses will always continue to have the tack, supplements, and state-of-the-art care that they need.

Similar to other sponsorship programs, individuals can contribute on a one-time basis, or on a repeated, regular basis.

The Westernaire Alumni Association officially began the Sponsor a Horse program at the 60th Anniversary gala event in August 2009, and we're happy that the program has already been a great success.

# Westernaires Recognized as Living Landmark

#### Award commemorates 30 years of commitment by Glen E. Keller, Jr.

On May 17th, the Golden Landmark Association, one of the oldest historical preservation institutions in the State of Colorado, designated the Westernaires a "Living Landmark" at an awards dinner and ceremony at Mount Vernon Country Club.

Also at that ceremony, the Westernaires Board of Directors recognized the commitment of Glen E. Keller Jr., who has served as the Director of Westernaires for the past 30 years. A copy of this recognition is now on display in the Equestrian Center at Fort Westernaire.

Mr. Elmer E. Wyland passed away on May 21st, 1983. The Westernaire Board of Directors appointed Keller as his successor the following day.



The Westernaires Board commissioned a piece of art from Westernaire alumnus Greg Whitaker (1993 graduate) as a token of their appreciation for his dedication. The picture portrays a team of horses being

driven: a particularly meaningful subject matter, as Keller demonstrates his love of driving at each year's National Western Stock Show parade. Several Westernaire Board members, as well as Greg Whitaker, attended the ceremony.

The Alumni Association congratulates Westernaires for this very honorable distinction, and congratulates Glen E. Keller, Jr. for his successes over the past 30 years.

On May 22, 1983, Glen E. Keller, Jr. accepted the responsibility of leading the Westernaires, following the death of the Founder, E.E. Wyland.

### A message from the Westernaire Wranglers

Alumni, friends and families: Please join us to support
Westernaires. This program costs nothing but a few moments
of your time. When you use your Westernaires King Soopers
Reloadable Gift Card - 5% of the amount you load onto the
card comes back to Westernaires thanks to the generosity of
King Soopers / Kroger.

#### Here's how it works:

- Purchase a reloadable gift card from Westernaires for \$5 – that card comes loaded with \$5 to spend on groceries, gas or pharmacy. Your card is reloadable as long as you keep a balance on the card - it can be loaded over and over again giving 5% back every time.
- Load your card. Simply stop by the customer service desk to load your card for any amount up to \$500, which can be used indefinitely (never expires). You can also reload at the register before they ring you up. Load your card by paying cash, check or credit - use a card that pays miles/points and double dip! A great way to budget for groceries/gas/pharmacy and "give" at the same time!

Use your card. Once the card is loaded, it's just like cash. It's a good idea to make a photo copy of the back of your card - scratch off the tab first to reveal pin code and check your balance anytime at www.gcbalance.com

The balance remaining on your card is always printed on your receipt as well.

King Soopers Reloadable Gift Cards are accepted at most Kroger affiliated stores throughout the U.S. – including Loaf 'N Jug - which means out of town family and friends can also participate to support Westernaires.

Oct. 26th & 27th


Visit, mix, and mingle with other alumni at the Alumni Association booth on the midway level of the Event Center.

Larry will provide you will a stall and a stall card. The stall fees have not yet been set, but will be approximately \$10.00 for the entire weekend. Please bring your own feed




**Above:** The Trailer Race at Annual Show 1955. **Below**: Grand Entry salutes at Annual Show 1991.
